

#### Obituary

On November 5, 1937 in Magnolia Mississippi, Obie and Edna Scott had a set of fraternal twins and one of them was Melvin Burnett Scott. Melvin attended and graduated from Url Bates High School, where he met his first wife Irene McClendon.

Melvín and Irene marríed ín the early 1960's, took a leap of faith and moved to Chicago, Illinois for a few years where they had their first son, (Everett). Shortly after, they moved to Los Angeles, CA., and they added a daughter (Valerie) and another son (Burnett). In 1971, Melvín and Irene dissolved the<mark>ir</mark> marriage and he moved to San Diego, CA.

After getting settled, Melvin united with The New Hope Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of the late Rev. James Allison, Sr. Pastor. Melvin was on the Usher Board, a dedicated Deacon, a Sunday school teacher and he was loved by so many for his whit, his smile and his charm. Melvin was a man of integrity, whose faith never wavered, and he loved the Lord with all his might. "He always said his job was to lead souls to the Lord" and that he did!

A few years later, Melvín and Irene reconcíled, she moved to San Díego, adding son, (Sterling) and daughter, (Florence) to the famíly. Some years later, the marriage was dissolved indefinitely.

In 1984, Melvín reconnected with a middle school sweetheart (Claretha Baker), who lived in Oxnard, CA. with her 5 children. After a few years of dating, Melvin and Claretha united in marriage on February 27, 1988 and she moved to San Diego.

Melvín worked as an Office Manager at The Boatyard in Point Loma for many years. In 1986 Melvín decided to start his own courier business called Fastway Express. This was a major milestone for him because so many doubted him due to his physical disability.

Melvin was born with a rare disease called Hip Dysplasia, that caused an infraction in his hip joints. Over time, he had several operations, but nothing worked. Eventually, the doctor's fused both hips and one of his knees. Because of the fusion, it altered the way he walked, but it never stopped him. Others felt sorry for him and thought he was handicap, when in fact he was HANDY CAPABLE!

As of January 2020, after 34 years of service to the greater San Diego County area, Melvin was forced to retire due to his declining health. After a 30-day stay in the Hospital and fighting for his life, he was released under hospice and returned home with his daughter on Tuesday, May 12, 2020. They spent several hours laughing and talking to catch up. However, as the evening progressed his health started to decline. The hospice nurses came and stayed with him, making him comfortable as possible. His daughter never left his side.

On Wednesday, May 13, 2020, the spirit and soul of Melvin Burnett Scott departed this life and was called home to be with the Lord. We know that he is a peace and is no longer in pain.

He was preceded in death by his parents Obie and Edna Scott; and his loving wife Claretha Baker Scott.
