Obituary

Blanchie P. Sutton was born November 12, 1954 in Benton, Mississippi. Her parents Oliver and Adlean Price preceded her in death. She received her preliminary education in Yazoo County Public Schools. She graduated from Benton High School in 1973. She attended Jackson State University graduating with a B.S. degree in Special Education in 1977. She later received a Master's degree in Guidance and Counseling and a Specialist Degree in Administration from Jackson State University.

In 1975 she married Lawrence Sutton of Prentiss, Mississippi, to that union four (4) children were born.

For many years she owned and operated First Start Learning and Development Center, focusing on teaching very young children. She taught Adult Education for the State of Mississippi, and later became Counselor for Special Population at Hinds Community College at both the Utica and Jackson Campus. She retired in 2003.
