She accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Tickfaw Missionary Baptist Church in Amite County. She later joined Shady Grove Free Will Baptist Church and when she lived in Chicago, IL she attended Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church and Evening Star Missionary Baptist Church.

Mrs. Patterson found delight in her 12 children. She attended every graduation, wedding and gathering whether it was local or out of town. She was the family's historian and communicator, taking on the responsibility of keeping precious photos, as well as current addresses and phone numbers for family and friends which she often share with others from memory.

A great gardener, she also canned. Her cha cha (chopped cabbage, allspice and vinegar) was great with soul food dinners.
